November is the only month used to represent a letter in the phonetic alphabet.

Although the word November dates back to Old English, the first known use of Novemberish, was by Robert Burns in 1793.

According to research published in 2008, serial killers are more likely to be born in November than any other month.

US Presidential elections are held every four years on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November.

Always starting on the same day of the week as March, and always ending on the same day of the week as August, November is the only month never mentioned in any of Shakespeare's works.

The name of the month of November comes from the Latin "novem", meaning "nine", because in the Roman calendar November was the ninth month of the year out of a total of ten months. With the adding of January and February at the beginning of the calendar after the Julian calendar reform, November became the eleventh month of the year, as we know it today.

In the UK, Australia, United States and Canada, November is associated with Movember (moustache November), a movement that encourages men to grow a moustache as a symbol of celebrating men's health and raise awareness regarding different male diseases.
